Kevin began the meeting by suggesting the group develop a definition of a project ticket. It was recommended that we develop consistent, repeatable clear method to determine if a ticket is a project ticket:

The subcommittee recommends the development of a Best Practices for project tickets.

Size and Scope of Ticket

Tickets or groups of tickets that are x,y,z size or smaller will be designated as regular ticket urban- city block to city block, block to block up to x amount of feet.

There was a brief discussion regarding white- lining: Two perspectives were shared: White- lining within the area/scope of a ticket that had been called into the one-call center provides clarification (a more exact indication of where the excavation will take place). 1) With regard to marking, if there is any question of the area surrounding the white line, i.e. the possibility of additional conflicts or facilities, the entire area should be marked. 2) Only the area in close proximity of the white line, or noted within the ticket (ex. 5' around the circle), needs to be marked.
